Role Description

The Register of Clinical Technologists (RCT) Equivalence Assessor

Term of Office	Ongoing. The Term of Office begins once online training has been completed.
Meetings	One training session at the start of the term, with refresher training as and when required. Optional online drop-in sessions held three times per year.
Who can apply?	Those working as a registered clinical technologist and who are actively registered on the RCT.
Why volunteer?	Volunteering is a great way to build your professional network, meet like-minded people and also gain exposure to new ideas and opportunities you may not have exposure to elsewhere while also contributing meaningfully to the profession.
	This can be personally fulfilling, help you plan and achieve next career steps, and of course contribute to the RCT's goal of public protection.
	The accredited RCT sets the standard for clinical technologist training and conduct and ensures high standards of practice are maintained amongst its registrants, and assessors play a crucial role in ensuring these standards are met.
Examples of work	Assessment of equivalence route applications against standards, providing applicants with feedback as and when required.
Time Commitment (Year)	Applications for assessment are distributed among assessors and we anticipate that the time commitment should not exceed more than one hour a week.
	Consideration is given to volunteers during periods of heightened workload, holidays, etc. and the IPEM national office makes efforts to accommodate volunteers' requirements around this.
What you can get out of it	Help develop the careers of those within the same profession through recognition and feedback of those applying for voluntary registration with the RCT.
	Skills developed through the assessment of applications and sharing feedback are widely transferable, while equivalence route application assessment can also count toward CPD.
Support available	The role is supported by dedicated members of staff at the IPEM national office, as well as by the RCT Management Board.
	There are also lead assessors who are available to provide help and guidance during assessments or as required.
	Three online drop-in sessions are hosted per year will allow you to meet with other assessors, members of the RCT management Board and administrative staff discuss any questions or concerns.
	Training resources will be available for new volunteers and anyone who wishes for any refresher training.
